No. 675.—IRELAND—EAST COAST.

Carlingford Lough—Lights Exhibited from Buoys.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 188 of 1898, further information, dated 14th October, 1899, has been received from the Irish Lights Office, that lights are exhibited from the buoys marking the channel through Carlingford Bar and the rocks in the lough, as follows:—

1. Starboard Hand Buoys, entering from seaward, viz.:—Nos. 4, 6, 10, and 12 (conical, red, &c.), each show a fixed white light.
