

new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill, of the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton and of the new parish of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill aforesaid which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed. should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Matthias Upper Tulse Hill situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias Upper Tulse Hill.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthias, Upper Tulse Hill comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime particular district) of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill of the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill, all in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour, Brixton Hill from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill aforesaid at a point in the middle of the road called Upper Tulse-hill at a distance of five chains or thereabouts from its junction with the road called Brixton-hill and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the first-named road for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the private roadway leading to Tulse Hill House and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said private roadway for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the south-eastern corner of the said house where the said private roadway bends towards the north and extending thence still eastward and in a direct line for a distance of seven and a half chains or thereabouts to a point upon the line of fences which forms the western boundary of the houses and premises situate upon the western side of the road called Tulse-hill, and extending thence northward along the said line of fences for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby passing in part along the eastern end of Craster-road, and along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Medora-road and along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of the southern end of Leander-road and thereby passing for a short distance along the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Tulse Hill from the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton aforesaid) to the point where the said line of fences is joined by the line of fences dividing the houses and premises situate on the north-eastern side of the northern end of the said Leander-road from the houses and premises situate on the south-western side of the south-western branch of Appach-road aforesaid, and extending thence north-westward along the last-described line of fences for a distance of seven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as Number 1 Leander-road from certain houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of the road called Josephine-avenue and extending thence first south-westward

along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its south-western end on the north-eastern side of Leander-road aforesaid and continuing thence south-westward and in a direct line across the last-named road for a distance of forty feet or thereabouts to a point on the south-western side of the same road at the northern end of the line of walls or fences which divide the houses and premises known respectively as Number 2 Leander-road and Number 1 Helix-road from certain other houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of the road called or known as Josephine-avenue as aforesaid and continuing thence that is to say from Leander-road aforesaid still south-westward along the last-described line of walls or fences to its south-western end on the north-eastern side of Helix-road aforesaid and continuing thence still south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of forty feet or thereabouts across the last-named road to a point on the south-western side of the same road at the north-eastern end of the line of walls or fences dividing the houses and premises known respectively as Number 2 Helix-road and as Number 1 Arodene-road from the houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of the road called Helix gardens and continuing thence that is to say from Helix-road aforesaid south-westward along the last-described line of walls or fences for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its south-western end on the north-eastern side of Arodene-road aforesaid extending thence first south-westward to, and then north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton from the new parish of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill aforesaid) to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the line of walls or fences dividing the houses and premises situate on the south-western side of Arodene-road aforesaid and the houses and premises situate on the north-eastern side of Fairmount-road, from the building and premises known as a Baptist Chapel and situate on the south-western side of Arodene-road aforesaid and from certain of the houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of the road called or known as Brixton Hill, and extending thence, that is, from the last-described point in the middle of Arodene-road aforesaid, first south-westward then south-eastward and then again south-westward to, and along the last-described line of walls or fences for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts to the south-western end of the same line of walls or fences on the north-eastern side of Fairmount-road aforesaid and continuing thence precisely in the last-mentioned direction that is to say south-westward and in a straight line across the last-named road to a point at the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of certain other houses and premises situate upon the south-eastern side of the road called or known as Brixton Hill as aforesaid, and extending thence that is from Fairmount-road aforesaid south-westward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the south-western end of the same wall or fence upon the north-eastern side of B-echedale-road, and extending thence first south-westward to, and then north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Brixton Hill aforesaid, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brixton Hill from the new parish of All Saints
