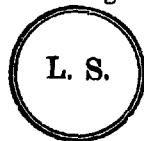

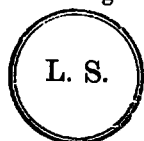
Withdrawal of Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

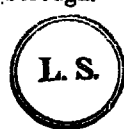
ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 2ND NOVEMBER 1899.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall not apply to the Exhibition intended to be held by the Birmingham Agricultural Exhibition Society at Bingley Hall, in the borough of Birmingham, on or about the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and following days.

2. The provisions of the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1897 shall not apply to or affect the movement out of the said borough of swine exhibited at the said Exhibition provided that the same are so moved from the said Exhibition by the nearest available route and with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the said borough.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Assistant of Customs in the Department of Her Majesty's Customs, will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Birmingham, Bristol, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Swansea, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, Cork, Galway, and Limerick, commencing on the 16th January, 1900, under the Regulations dated the 5th May, 1899, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.
