THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the parish of Swindon, in the county of Wilts, the Urban District Council of Old Swindon, the Urban District Council of Swindon New Town, and the Swindon Water Board, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:—

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885 it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish of Swindon in the county of Wilts on the sixteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight presented a petition to Her Majesty the Queen praying for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said petition was referred to the Committee of Council and it was proposed by the Charter to create the parish of Swindon a Municipal Borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be so created. And Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Council was pleased to approve the grant of a Charter in accordance with such petition.

And whereas the areas of the Urban Districts of Swindon New Town and Swindon Old Town together comprise the area of the parish of Swindon.

And whereas "The Swindon Water Act 1894" enabled the Local Boards for the Urban Districts of Old Swindon and Swindon New Town to acquire and vest the undertaking of the Swindon Water Works Company Limited in a Water Board to authorize the construction of additional water works for the supply of water and for other purposes as in the said Act is mentioned and contained. And by the same Act it was provided that a Water Board should be formed the same

to be composed as in the said Act provided. And it was further provided that the Board should be a Body Corporate by the name of the Swindon Water Board and should subject to the provisions of the said Act be entrusted with the maintenance and management of the Water Undertaking.

And whereas divers loans and monies were raised or are owing under the said Act.

And whereas by a Provisional Order granted by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 and 1888 and confirmed by "The Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1895" (hereinafter called "the Swindon Electric Lighting Order") powers were given to the Swindon New Town Urban District Council for the supply of electricity for public and private lighting and other purposes within the whole of the Urban District of Swindon New Town as constituted at the commencement of that Order.

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board of the seventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven the then Local Board for the District of Swindon New Town was constituted a Registration Authority for the purposes of "The Canal Boats Act 1877."

And whereas the cemetery is provided under the provisions of "The Public Health Interments Act 1879" and the lands and buildings forming such cemetery are vested in the Swindon New Town Urban District Council and the same is managed and maintained by that Authority and the Old Swindon Urban District Council jointly and the capital outlay involved in the purchase of land of erection of buildings and laying out of the cemetery was borne by both the said Authorities.

And whereas certain loans in connection with the cemetery have been raised and are partly owing from the said District Councils respectively.

And whereas the site of the technical schools was acquired by the Swindon New Town Urban District Council and the school buildings were erected thereon by the said Swindon New Town Urban District Council and building grants towards the cost of such erection were received from the Wilts County Council and from the Science and Art Department and the schools are now managed by a committee appointed by the Swindon New Town Urban District Council and in addition to the annual Government Grant the maintenance is borne and contributed by the Swindon New Town Urban District Council and the Old Swindon Urban District Council jointly

at an equal rate per pound (not exceeding one penny in the pound).

And whereas the said site and schools are vested in the Swindon New Town Urban District Council.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Elementary Education Act 1870" and the Acts amending the same a school board was formed for the school district of the parish of Swindon.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the borough of Swindon when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the county of Wilts.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by and are in force within the districts of the said Urban District Councils namely: "The Infectious Diseases Notification Act 1889" "The Infectious Disease Prevention Act 1890" and "The Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act 1890."

And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department to the Local Government Board and to the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department).

And whereas the said Urban District Councils the Swindon Water Board and the said School Board are Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1882" as amended by "The School Boards Act 1885."

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885 and every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct order and declare as follows:—

Short Title.

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Swindon Scheme 1900.

Commencement of Scheme.

This Scheme when confirmed shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter and this Scheme shall be construed and apply as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

Sanitary Authority.

The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this Scheme and thenceforth be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Swindon acting by the Council of the borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

Urban District Councils and Swindon Water Board abolished.

The Urban District Council of Swindon New Town and the Urban District Council of Old Swindon and the Swindon Water Board and their respective powers duties rights obligations and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have

continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough and the said Urban District Councils and Water Board shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy be subject to and exercise the said powers duties rights obligations liabilities and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted and all their respective acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this Scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Urban District Councils and Water Board shall be abolished and cease to exist and the existing division into Wards of their respective Districts shall also be abolished and cease to exist.

Transfer of Jurisdiction Property &c. of Urban District Councils and Water Board.

All the jurisdiction rights powers authorities duties and property vested in or possessed by the Urban District Councils and the Swindon Water Board or in any of them in any capacity under any Act of Parliament or Order of a Government Department or otherwise or by any person or body in trust for them or either of them or any or either of their members as such or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the said Urban District Councils or Water Board or any of their members as such (and not otherwise expressly transferred by or dealt with under this Scheme) shall be exercisable by and attached to and vested in the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Swindon (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") for the municipal and other public purposes of the said borough.

All liabilities whatsoever (including liability in respect of all loans raised by either District Council or the Swindon Water Board and liability in respect of all loans and annuities in connection with the Cemetery Water Works or otherwise) which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Urban District Councils and Swindon Water Board or any of them in any capacity or against any property or funds of the said Councils and Water Board shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation. Any investigation legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt liability penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Urban District Councils and Water Board in any capacity before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll and all franchises privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value and all charters records deeds books and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any property so defined.

The District Fund and the General District Rate of the borough of Swindon shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1882" with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and the Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Funds and General District

Rates of the Urban District Councils respectively and the Common Fund and contributions thereto of the Swindon Water Board and all sums of money payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged on or attaching to the district funds or general district rates of the Urban District Councils and Swindon Water Board shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to from or out of and shall be charged on the District Fund and General District Rate leviable in the said borough.

With respect to the above recited local Act and the above recited Orders of the Local Government Board and Board of Trade and with respect to any acts matters and things to be done thereunder the following provisions shall take effect.

The Corporation acting by the Council shall be substituted in all respects for the Urban District Councils and Swindon Water Board respectively and all the rights property powers authorities privileges duties and liabilities vested in devolving upon or exercisable by the said Urban District Councils and Swindon Water Board and any of them and not otherwise dealt with under this Scheme shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable by and against the Corporation. All loans and monies secured upon the funds or rates of the said District Councils and Water Board or any of them shall be secured upon the District Fund and General District Rate of the Corporation acting by the Council in lieu of the funds or rates upon which they were secured immediately before the commencement of this Scheme and as if they had been originally secured upon the said District Fund and General District Rate.

The provisions of the Swindon Electric Lighting Order shall extend to the whole of the said borough as though the whole of the borough had originally been within the limits of the Order.

The Town Clerk of the borough of Swindon shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the respective Clerks to the Urban District Councils and Swindon Water Board.

Subject as aforesaid and to the other provisions of this Scheme the provisions of the said Acts and Orders which are in force at the commencement of this Scheme shall continue in full force and effect and shall be construed as extended and modified by this Scheme.

Bye-Laws.

Any bye-laws, any regulations under the Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885, and any tables of fees and charges, in force at the commencement of this Scheme in the area of the Urban District of New Swindon included in the borough, shall, unless repealed varied or revoked continue in force within the borough in like manner and with the like effect as if the Corporation and their officers and the borough were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or Urban District Council of Swindon New Town or the Water Board as the case may be and their officers and the District.

School Board.

The Swindon School Board shall be the School Board for the borough of Swindon by the name of the Swindon Borough School Board in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Swindon School Board by the Education Department the borough of Swindon had been a Municipal Borough. Everything in connection with the said Board shall be done had and construed accordingly.

All the rights interests powers property obligations liabilities and assets attaching to and vested

in the Swindon School Board immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be and continue attached to and vested in the Swindon Borough School Board and all charges charged on the School Fund and in respect of liabilities of the Swindon School Board on the poor rate of the parish of Swindon immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charged upon the School Fund of the Swindon Borough School Board and upon the borough rate or fund of the said borough and not otherwise.

Any Bye-laws made by the Swindon School Board under the Acts relating to public elementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Swindon Borough School District.

Savings for Rates.

Notwithstanding the Incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this Scheme all rates assessments compositions charges mortgages contracts leases conveyances deeds documents acts matters and things made entered into or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to or with reference to the Urban District Councils and Water Board and any of them shall be as good valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made entered into or done by to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the Urban District Councils and Water Board and each or either of them and all arrears of rates and charges may be recovered and all pending proceedings may be continued and completed in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein instead of the Urban District Councils or Water Board or either of them.

Compensation for existing Officers.

If any officer of the Urban District Councils and Water Board or of any of the Public Bodies for whom the Corporation or the Council of the borough of Swindon are respectively substituted who shall have been employed by the said Urban District Councils or Water Board or any of them or by any of the said Public Bodies as the case may be shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him or her such officer unless dismissed from employment for misconduct shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his or her position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Municipal Borough such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Treasury to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his or her position and the Treasury in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Acts 1834 to 1892 to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Acts stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the first meeting of the Council he or she shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he or she had not been

employed by the said Council. Provided that the term officer shall include any person employed by the Urban District Councils or Water Board or any of them or by any of the public bodies for whom the Corporation or the Council of the borough of Swindon are respectively substituted whose salary or emolument is payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other person. Provided also that the Treasury shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever and as to the amount thereof and the Treasury shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause and further every determination of the Treasury upon any such right title claim amount or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the Treasury consider just and reasonable.

Audit of Accounts of Urban District Councils and Water Board.

The accounts of the Urban District Councils and Water Board and their respective officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers duties provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act 1875" as amended by "The District Auditors Act 1879" and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils and Water Boards and their officers shall apply to any such audit and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Urban District Councils and Water Board shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable any such audit to be duly made but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time extent character and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified by the District Auditor at any such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.

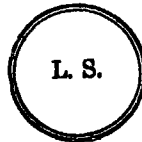
