(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.) ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 31st JANUARY 1900.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the

Schedule to this Order.

2. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved along a highway or thoroughfare within the District described in the Schedule to this Order.

3. Provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked or rebooked within such District.
