Inner Sambro Island—Light Established.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 9th January, 1900, that a white fixed dioptric light, elevated 45 feet above high water and visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles, has been established for the use of fishermen on the western extreme of Inner Sambro Island, entrance to Sambro Harbour.

It is shown from a white mast, 17 feet high, situated about 30 yards within the point, and exhibited annually from 1st December to 30th April.
