WILD BIRD PROTECTION.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of
Carnarvon) Order, 1900.

Dated 8th March, 1900.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me
by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896,
and upon application by the County Council of
the Administrative County of Carnarvon, I
hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild
Birds Protection (County of Carnarvon) Order,
1900."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing and
taking of the following Wild Birds is prohibited
by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout
the county of Carnarvon, so as to be from the
1st day of March to the 30th day of September in
each year, both days inclusive:—

American Quail, Auk, Avocet, Bee Eater,
Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulter-
neb, Cuckoo, Dotterel, Dunlin, Fern Owl, Fulmar,
Gannet, Goatsucker, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank,
Guillemot, Gull (except Blackbacked Gull),
Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Loon, Marrot, Mer-
ganser, Murre, Nighthawk, Nightingale, Night-
jar, Oriole, Owl, Oxbird, Oyster Catcher, Petrel,
Phalarope, Ploverspage, Puffin, Purre, Razorbill,
Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling,
Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Seamew, Sea Parrot,
Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Shelldrake, Skua, Smew,
Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew,
Stonehatch, Summer Snipe, Tarrock, Tern, Thick
Knee, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Willock,
Woodpecker.

*The Goldfinch protected during the whole of the
Year.*

III. During the period from the 1st day of
August in any year to the last day of February
following, both days inclusive, the taking or kill-
ing of the Goldfinch is prohibited throughout the
County of Carnarvon.

Repeal of Former Order.

IV. The Order of the 26th day of May, 1896,
is hereby repealed.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 8TH MARCH 1900.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in
exercise of the powers in them vested under the
Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and
of every other power enabling them in this behalf,
do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this
Order shall from and after the commencement of
this Order cease to be a Swine-Fever Infected
Area and no part thereof shall be subject to the
provisions of the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order
of 1898.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the
twelfth day of March, one thousand nine
hundred.
