ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 12TH MARCH 1900.)

NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK SALES AND MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Alteration of Boundaries of Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) The Scheduled District for the purposes of this Order and of the Norfolk and Suffolk Sales and Movement (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 shall after the commencement of this Order be the District described in the First Schedule to this Order.

(2.) Part II of the Norfolk and Suffolk Sales and Movement (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 is revoked, and the following provisions are substituted therefor.

Movement within Scheduled District for purposes other than Slaughtering.

2.—(1.) An animal may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area) to any other premises within such District for purposes of breeding, feeding, isolation, or lambing, provided that the animal is accompanied
