Nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of such Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the Officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of Nurse at the

said Workhouse:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the Sheffield Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a Statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse in the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to such Nurses, and We approve such Statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the above-cited Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any such person, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said Statement and approved by Us.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 16th day of June, 1897, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of George Haslehurst as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The North-Eastern Counties Audit District";

And whereas the Luddenden Foot Joint Sewerage Board is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the said Joint Sewerage Board and of their Officers be assigned to the said George Haslehurst:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We

hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be the duty of the said George Haslehurst to audit the Accounts of the said Joint Sewerage Board, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article III of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said Joint Sewerage Board shall be deemed to be within the said North-Eastern Counties Audit District.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 14TH MARCH 1900.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by Steamship Aldworth.

1. It shall not be lawful during the continuance of this Order for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any animals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamship Aldworth, registered at the port of Sunderland, official number 98540, and now owned by James Westoll, and such conveyance of animals by that vessel is hereby prohibited accordingly.

Offences.

2. If an animal is conveyed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:

"Master" includes a person having the charge or command of the vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement and Duration.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred, and shall cease to operate from and immediately after the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one.
