No. 206.—UNITED STATES—NORTH CAROLINA.

Cape Hatteras—Wreck North-Eastward of, Removed.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 75 of 1900:—

The United States Government has given further notice, that on 30th January, 1900, the masts were removed from the wreck which sank in a position from which the light on the extreme of Cape Hatteras bore S. 84° W., distant 23 miles.

The wreck is no longer a danger to navigation, as there is a depth of not less than 12 fathoms over it. It has, therefore, been erased from the Chart.
