

directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the said Act.

(3.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle, sheep, goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the said Act.

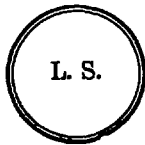
Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.
