mencement of this Order revoked : Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred. Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 2).
