Translation of Circular No. 5834 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste to all Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers.

By decree of April 27th, 1900, No. 19750, of the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce, in union with the Imperial and Royal Ministry of the Interior, the regulations contained in Government Circular of June 17th, 1897, No. 5684, issued according to despatch of the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce of May 24th, 1897, No. 24184, contained in the *Annuario Marittimo* for 1898, page 191 (Marine Board Official Book), respecting the sanitary treatment of vessels in case of plague, will have to be enforced to vessels arriving from yellow fever infected ports, with the only modification, that instead of a period of twelve days decreed for plague in paragraphs II and III of the above-mentioned Government Circular, nine days only will be undergone for yellow fever, whilst instead of an observation period of ten days, foreseen for plague in paragraph V, No. 2, and in paragraph VI penultimate chapter of the above said Government Circular, a period of only seven days will be undergone for yellow fever.

issued by the Board of Health giving details of the quarantine measures imposed against Smyrna:—

Telegramme-Circulaire aux offices de Sants adresse en date du 3/16 Mai 1900.

Par décision du Conseil Supérieur de Santé:

1° Les voyageurs quittant Smyrne par mer devront se rendre préalablement au lazaret de Clazomènes où ils subiront une quarantaine d'observation de 48 heures ainsi que la désinfection de leurs hardes et effets. Ces voyageurs ne pourront s'embarquer pour une destination quelconque sur le littoral de l'Empire, que seulement du lazaret susnommé.

Les navires quittant Smyrne, à partir du 4/17 Mai courant, à destination d'autres ports Ottomans se rendront préalablement au lazaret de Clazomènes où leurs cales seront désinfectées au moyen de gaz asphyxiant, en vue de détruire les rats qui s'y trouveraient. Après quoi, ces navires seront autorisés à embarquer des voyageurs.

Les dits navires avec leurs voyageurs subiront une visite médicale au premier port à médecin Sanitaire. Cette visite pour les navires et voyageurs à destination de la Capitale se fera aux Dardanelles et sera répétée à l'arrivée à Constantinople.

2° Les voyageurs quittant Smyrne par terre en chemin-de-fer ou autrement seront, après avoir subi une visite médicale et la désinfection chimique de leurs hardes et effets, munis d'un certificat sanitaire individuel et, à leur arrivée à destination, soumis à la visite journalière du Médecin Municipal.

Chaque train quittant Smyrne sera accompagné d'un médecin chargé de surveiller la santé des voyageurs pendant le trajet.

3° Les dispositions du Règlement sur la salubrité des villes élaboré par la Commission d'hygiène de Constantinople, seront rigoureusement appliquées dans la ville de Smyrne par les soins de l'Autorité locale.

4° Les pèlerins se trouvant actuellement au lazaret de Clazomènes y termineront la quarantaine prescrite à leur égard.

Les arrivages ultérieurs de pèlerins seront dirigés sur le lazaret de Stampalia.

5. No vessel containing carbide of calcium shall be opened within the limits of the jurisdiction of the Harbour Authority except in some licensed place of storage, or with the written consent of the Harbour Master in such place as he may direct.

6. Every reasonable precaution shall be taken to prevent the contact of water or moisture with the carbide of calcium, and where such contact may have occurred, to prevent the gas evolved from being ignited.
