On Sunday laft arfived here a Courrier Extraordinary from the Pope, with diffpatches for the faid General, which the Nuncio receiving, mamediately fent away by a Felucca.

On Wednelday last in the Evening, arrive ! a Cour, rier in 7 days from his most Christian Myesty, with Lee. ters alluring us of the Ratification and Publication of the Peace between the two Crow sif France and Spain, which was the next morning communicated by the Duke de Chaulnes the French Ambailador to His H lineis, who received it with infinite joy and fatisfaction, and prejently after, acquainted the College of Cardinals and the Ambaffadors and Ministers of foreign Princes, will the wels come Lidings, which was for three Evenings fucceffively entertained with Bonfires, Lights, a d o her figus of joy, and the firing of Guns from the Caffel St. Angele 3 and on Sunday after, a folemn Proceffion in St. Peters, Ts Leum was folemnly lung in pre ence of the Pope and the whole Court.

On Tuesday last, the Cardinal de Medici pook his fo-

lemn leave of the Pope in order to his teturn to Florense. Vensee, fune 16. A Veffe lately arriving from Durageo on Monday laft, tells us that touching at Ragufe, they + no that City has made a confiderable ad ance in eparation of the ruins cauled by the prodigious Barthquak: , and are now revising their Trade. That the Turks were drawi g together about Euf-fins and Albania , inten ing to make tone incursions upon Dalmatia. That fom fira'l parties of them had already adventured into Pofstdaria, but returned again with lighe or no boory ; the Country people having before-hand (coursed their Goods, and joyned with a confiderable party of Morlachs } the News whereof hat ub iged the 111 ks to retire themfelves with much speed.

A Ship from Regufelt ving ton hed on Wednelday lást in the Evening at Corfu, tells us of a warm report of lome action fately passed between our Admiral and the Tukish Fleet, in which we had gained a confider ble Victory, fink ing five of the Enemies Gallies, and taking 15, with two thips laden with Provisions and Attiliery's of which good Ne s we are yet in do ubt, till farther Confirmation.

Ratisbonne, June 18. The States of the Empire fill continue their Allemb y as formerly, but have not of late made any confiderable progress into any Affairs of impor-tance, and have of late been him red by realout the death of the Cardinal of Sa'tzbourgh, who prefided in Hait Affembly in the Name and 1 lace of the Emperour, in wholeroom 'is believed will thorely be difpatch hither the Count a' Avenaturg, His Imperial Mighties Principal Minister of State; at who carrival the Atlembly may proceed with greater vigor.

His Highnels the Elector of Bavaria full-continues his Levice, which 'tis supposed may be designed for Savoy; where as yet the differences between that Duke and the Lity of Geneva are not fully composed.

We have here much dilc urle of a Treaty concluded between His Imperial Msjefty and the Crown of Sweden, by which both parties are mutually screed paffifteach other, in cale any attempts be made upon them 5 with fome Articles relating to the Dutchy of Breme: of the truth thereof, with the particulars, we expect a farther Account.

We are also t ld of another Assembly of the Neighbouring Princes of the Empire, which will be shortly held at Cologne; But whether in order to giving a longer time to the Alliance of the Princes of the *Rhi* e, or for the furine security of the Empire and the Frontiers against all Invalions, or some other subject, is yet unce tain.

Diennis, June 19. The peace being now fetted between the two Clowns of *spain* and France; 'tis believed, the Emperour will give speedy Orders for the reducing his forces to a leffer number.

His Highnels, the Elector of Saxony, and his Durchels, with the young Prince and Princels, are expected here abour the 29th inflart; (everal freat houles being already fornithing to receive them; the Chancellour, and feveral Gentlemen of their Train are before her arrived to take carefograll conveniencies for their ent atainment, who,'the believed may continue here till the tilra of *July* (the Braprefers birth-day) to take part of the Divertilements which are preparing against that time.

The States of Hungary with as much earnellnels as ever, are prefling His Imperial Majelty for a redrefs of their Grievances, from which Countrey our Letters inform us, that hapfs continues fill his demands of 200 thouland Ducats, with interest, from the Prince Ragos ki, which if refuled, he threatens to recover by force.

Hague, June 26. Several perfons belonging to the young Printe of Denmark, are lately arrived here, and himielf in few dayes expected a f p whole Reception and Entertainment, P ince Mairie had defigned his own Houle, but the young Prince intending only to be treated incognito, 'tis believed he has made choice of fome other Lodgings.

The Heer Carifius, É voy Extraordinary from His Majefty of Denmark, has lately prefied hard for the payment of feveral fumms, which he pretends to be due upoh promife to the King his Mafter, particula ly, 400000 Rix-Dollars from the States of Holland, and 14000 from those of Amfterdam; the justness of which pretentions has been the fubject of many conferences and debates, and for the determination of the business between both parties, they have agreed to fubmit it to the Arbitration of the Most Chriftian King.

Prince Manrice is this day let forwards on his journey for *Eerlin*; to whom, before his departure the States were pleaied to give 25 thouland Linnes in confiders ion of his Expences in making preparation for his Embally, which was to merly intended for Vienna.

¹The Commissioner Breuckel, having been committed upon sufficient of having employ d to his private use, Goods belonging to the Publick, of considerable value, lately made his escape from prison 3 whereupon, the States by their Proclamation, have promised 2000 Liares to any perion that thall give notice of him for his apprehention, promising befides the faid reward to pardon any of his accomplices, who shall be infrumental in his discovery, and forbidding all, perfons whatloever, to entertain or conceal him under the fenalty of being proceeded against as perions guilty of the fame Crime, several of his Relationsare already taken and committed. The Conftable Wrangle, is within few dayes expected here, at whole arrival, the Swedish forces hope to know their doom, as to their future employments or difbanding.

From Weffphalia we are told, that the Bilhop of Munfter begins now to dimits fon e Companies of the Army lately railed by him, which much lessens the jealousies and apprehensions of the Neighbour bood.

We have lately a current report, that fome few days fince there has been a intert rencounter about Heilige-Land, between two Privateers of Oftend, and a French mas of War of 40 Guns, with a ship under his Convoy, laden with brais Guns from Gluckfiadt 5 that after a long difputes the Fiench man of War was forced with much damige to quit the engagement, leaving the Oftende sin purfuit aft ter the o.her if ip, of which we are in expect 1 a of a farther conformation with more particulars,

From Varmft idt we are told, that the Lorainers begin again to put thei. Neighbours upon the r Guards, having lately appear d with more then ulual firength up in the fromtie sot Gernan, but with what defin is as yet unknowns However, the Countrey people neer the Rhine, begin to fecure themfelves and the reft of their Goods; and his Highnefs, the Prince Elector Palatine has put himfelf in a poflure of defence, in cafe any thing flould be attempted to his prejudice. Several of the firsgling Lorainers have been taken and fent prifoners to the Fort of Manheim. The French have on all parts within drawn their forces, leaving the Coun-, treys on the borders in peace, and have taken down the Bridge of Boats, which they were building neer Philipsbourgh.

Whitehall, June 24. On Monday laft His Majefly accompanied by his Royal Highnefs, and tis Highnefs Prince Rupers, and attended by feveral of the Eminent Perfons of the Court, went down in his Yacht to Sheernefs, to take a View of the Fortifications which are there raising and much advanced.

From aboa d the Monmonth in the Downs, Fune 23. This day His Mzjesty and Royal Highnels came into the Downs to take a view of the Fleet which is riding there, going, aboard Sir Thomas Al en and Sir Feremy Smith, and afterwards set sail again towards London.

Yesternight came into the Downs, the St. David, and this day the Success is the Merchants thips, which lay here outward bound, tailed yesterday to the Award.
