Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Notice is hereby given, according to § 2 of the Quarantine Law of the 12th July, 1848, that ports in Egypt and Manila shall be regarded until further notice as smitten with the Oriental pest, and that the quarantine regulations contained in the Law above mentioned and in the notice of the 12th of September, 1899, and relating to quarantine, &c., in cases of pest, are to come into force immediately.

Notice is further given that ports in Paraguay declared to be pest-smitten in the Proclamation of the 27th October, 1899, shall no longer be regarded as pest-smitten.

the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number-plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or re-main in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demanded for the
