No. 385.—UNITED STATES—NORTH CAROLINA, CAPE FEAR RIVER.

Bald Head—Leading Lights Exhibited.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 30th June, 1900, leading lights will be established on Bald Head, at the entrance to Cape Fear River:—

Bald Head front light will be red fixed, elevated 12 feet above high water; it will be shown from a pyramidal wooden structure, painted white, erected nearly a quarter of a mile N. 8½° W. from Cape Fear Lighthouse.

Approximate position, lat. 33° 52' 25" N., long. 78° 0' 10" W.

The rear light is red fixed, elevated 15 feet above high water, and shown from a similar structure, erected about 2 cables N. 70° E. from the front light.

These two lights in line N. 70° E., in conjunction with the New Channel leading lights, lead through the Bald Head Channel into Cape Fear River.
