

that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Philip situate at West Bromwich as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip West Bromwich.'

"And with the like consent of the said Augustus Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield and of the said Charles Walter Carrington (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Philip situate at West Bromwich as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Philip, West Bromwich, being:—

"All that part of the district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield which is bounded upon the north by the parish of (All Saints) West Bromwich upon the east and south-east by the new parish of Saint James Handsworth upon the south and south-west by the particular district of the Holy Trinity West Bromwich all in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said particular district of the Holy Trinity West Bromwich from the district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich aforesaid at the junction of High-street with Bull-street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with that part of Walsall-street which is also known as Virgin End and extending thence northward along the middle of the said part of the last-named street for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Reform-street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Seagar-street and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same street with Woodward-street which boundary divides the said district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich from the parish of (All Saints) West Bromwich aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the

said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the new parish of Gomersal and of the new parish of Christ Church Liversedge all in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two and published in the London Gazette upon the twelfth day of July following a part of the parish of Birstal in the said county of York and at that time in the diocese of Ripon was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint John situate within the limits of such parish and the same was called 'The Chapelry District of Saint John Cleckheaton.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fourth day of March in the last-mentioned year another part of the said parish of Birstal was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and the same was called 'The District of Gomersal.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of November in the said last-mentioned year and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fourth day of the same month the boundaries of the said district of Gomersal were altered so as to dis sever a certain portion of such district and to restore such portion to the parish of Birstal aforesaid.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of July in the year one
