Milan, Nov. 26. The German Regiments of Horse of Montecucule and Bareith, with that of Foot of Lorrain and part of Sceinau, have taken their Quarters in the Duchy of Mantus. The Bavarian Regiments of Foot, with the Dragoons of Savoy, are lodged in Modens, and one of Cuirassiers in the Dutchy of Parma. The rest are quartered in Montserras, except those that are marched towards the Scate of Genous. But how these last will be disposed of now that the Republick Iris bought off the Quarters with a Sum of Money, is not yet known.

Loscadi in Transisvania, Novemb. 14. On the seventh Instant the Imperial Forces, commanded by General Veserani, marched from Harro; and having passed the River Maros, encamped near a place called Paz. The same day the Baron de Giney, who was taken Prisoner by the Tartars near Great Waradin, and asterwards obtained his Liberty upon paying a Ransom, arrived in the Camp, with the Consirmation, That Teckeley had repissed the Maros, and marched towards Temfaver. The Weather being grown very cold, the General thought fit to separate his Troops on the 8th, and to quarter them in the Villages between Sasvaros, Hadzecke, and Hunya, towards the Iron Gate, in such mance: as that the greatest part of them may, upon occation, be drawn together again in sew hours: And he took his Head-Quarter them in this place. The oth we had advice, That ha Greved in Hangary this last Campigne, were returning home through Valachia.
