THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Berlin, transmitting the following translation of a Notification published in the Imperial Gazette of the 11th instant :—

Decree relative to the restrictions on the importation and transport of articles directed against the introduction of Cholera or Plague, July 4th, 1900.

The Federal Council has resolved on the basis of §§ 24 and 25 of the law of June 30th, 1900, for the suppression of diseases constituting a public danger (Reichs: Gesetzblatt p. 306), that the following regulations shall come into force in case of a danger of cholera or plague and in respect of the introduction and transport from abroad of goods and of articles of use.

(1.) The introduction and transport is interdicted of body linen, of old and used articles of clothing, of used bed linen and of rags and tatters of every description.

(2.) The prohibition mentioned in paragraph (1) does not apply to body and bed linen, which travellers take with them for their personal use; permission for their introduction may however be made to depend on a preliminary disinfection.

(3.) The Imperial Chancellor is empowered to permit exceptions to the prohibition by means of a Decree imposing the requisite precautionary measures.
