Floating Wrecks.

INFORMATION has been published in the
Shipping Gazette of the following floating wrecks
reported by the Masters of the steamships "Earls-
wood," "Benedick," and "Lord Lansdowne," as
having been passed on July 7th and 8th, 1900:—

a. A floating wreck of a large ship, bottom up,
in approximately lat. $50^{\circ} 6'$ N., long. $15^{\circ} 36'$ W.

b. A wreck of a sunken vessel, in approximately
lat. $51^{\circ} 6'$ N., long. $14^{\circ} 45'$ W.

c. A wreck of a supposed sunken vessel, in
approximately lat. $51^{\circ} 20'$ N., long. $12^{\circ} 15'$ W.
