

5 Avril 1897 prescrivant des mesures sanitaires relativement à l'importation et au transit des marchandises provenant de pays ou de circonscriptions territoriales déclarés contaminés de choléra et de peste ;

Vu spécialement les articles 5 et 6 de cet arrêté, chargeant le Ministre de l'Agriculture de désigner les pays ou parties de pays à l'égard desquels le régime prévu par les articles 1er à 4 des dits arrêtés concernant l'importation et le transit des marchandises, sera rendu applicable, et de régler les mesures à prendre dans les ports, au point de vue de la visite médicale, de l'isolement et de la désinfection, à l'égard des navires considérés comme infectés, suspects ou indemnes,

Arrête :

ART. 1er. 1° Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 des arrêtés royaux du 15 Juillet 1895 et 5 Avril 1897 susvisés sont rendues applicables aux provenances du littoral arabique de la mer Rouge au sud de Jambo, contaminés par le choléra et la peste ;

2° Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 de l'arrêté royal du 5 Avril 1897 susvisés, sont rendues applicables aux provenances des ports de Smyrne et de Rio de Janeiro contaminés par la peste.

ART. 2. Ces provenances, arrivant par mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les ports d'Ostende et de Nieuport, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, aux régimes stipulés par le titre VIII de la Convention sanitaire internationale de Dresden et par les chapitres II, III et IV du règlement sanitaire général annexé à la Convention sanitaire internationale de Venise, en date du 19 Mars 1897.

Le Ministère des Affaires Etrangères a l'honneur d'informer la Légation Royale que le Gouvernement Royal vient de prendre les mesures sanitaires suivantes relativement aux provenances de l'Asie Mineure :—

1. Les vilayets de Trébizonde et d'Aidin sont déclarés infectés par la peste, et les provenances de ces localités sont soumises aux mesures sanitaires quarantaine mentionnées dans la circulaire ministérielle, No. 11,458 du 17/30 Juin dernier.

2. Le reste du littoral de la Turquie d'Asie est déclaré suspect d'être atteint par la peste, et les provenances de ces parages seront soumises à une observation médicale à Soulina ; les voyageurs seront en outre soumis pendant 10 jours à des visites médicales dans le Royaume s'ils venaient à s'y arrêter.
