Extensions of Limits of Scheduled District.

1. The limits of the District referred to as the Scheduled District in the Perthshire and Clackmannanshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900, dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred, are hereby extended so as to comprise the District described in the Schedule to this Order, and the District so described shall be subject to the provisions of the said Order of the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred, and be the Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order shall be read with the Perthshire and Clackmannanshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900, and may be cited as the Perthshire and Clackmannanshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 (No. 2).

The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penulty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.
- 2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand nine hundred.
