lawful anything done under either of the Orders hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, either of the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

#### Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred.

#### Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the STAFFORD-SHIRE, DERBYSHIRE, LEIGESTERSHIRE, AND WAR-WICKSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 3).
