The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Montevideo, enclosing the following Quarantine Notice, viz. :—

The Quarantine Plague.

The National Council of Hygiene has issued the following Ordinance for the treatment of vessels from ports infested with or suspected of bubonic pest :—

ART. 1. Vessels arriving from infected or suspected ports shall be submitted to five and four days' sanitary observation (quarantine) respectively.

This observation shall commence to count, for vessels which bring a sanitary inspector, from the day of their departure, provided the inspector has practised the disinfection of the luggage, and the medical inspection of the passengers and crew.

ART. 2. For vessels not bringing a sanitary inspector, the observation shall count from the medical inspection and disinfection to be practised on their arrival.

ART. 3. Infected vessels shall fulfil ten days' observation, counting from their disinfection.

ART. 4. The personal luggage (equipajes) of the passengers and crew, postal packets, objects of personal and domestic use, and clothes in whatever condition (the Spanish word used is *trapos*, which may be translated as clothes, cloths or rags indifferently), shall be disinfected. Mails and cargo shall be admitted without any restriction.

ART. 5. Articles or objects belonging to the luggage of the passengers, and which in the opinion of the Sanitary Authority are capable of transmitting the germs of disease and cannot be disinfected, shall not be admitted.

ART. 6. For the effects of the present Ordinance, the ports of Glasgow and Rio Janeiro are declared infected, and Santos and the other ports of Scotland are declared suspected.

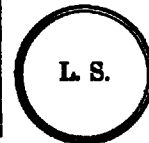

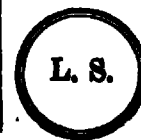

*Pilot Bank—not in Assigned Position.*

INFORMATION, dated 27th July, 1900, has been received from Commodore R. L. Groome, in command of Her Majesty's vessels on the South-east Coast of America, that Her Majesty's ships "Beagle," "Basilisk," and "Pegasus" have during the present year obtained lines of soundings over the supposed position of the Pilot Bank without obtaining any evidence of its existence.

This bank, which is shown as lying between the parallels of 21° 39' and 21° 53' south latitude and the meridians of 39° 40' and 39° 52' west longitude, was originally reported by Her Majesty's brig "Pilot" in 1843.

There can be little doubt that the soundings marked were struck and followed by that ship on the course shown on the Chart, but as the longitude may have been considerably in error, it is probable that their correct position lies considerably to the westward, where the scanty soundings on the Chart afford considerable evidence of an uneven bottom.

As it is evident that the bank does not exist in the position now shown on the Admiralty Charts, Nos. 530, 3108, it has been expunged from those Charts.
