2. The provisions of the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1897 shall not apply to or affect the movement out of the said borough of swine exhibited at the said Exhibition provided that the same are so moved from the said Exhibition by the nearest available route and with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the said borough.
