

Dunsfold and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of one mile and forty-five chains or thereabouts (thereby passing under the Portsmouth direct line of the London and South Western Railway) to the point where the same stream meets the boundary which divides the said parish of Witley from the parish of Chiddingfold aforesaid and extending thence first generally south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts (thereby continuing to follow the course of the last-described stream) to the point where such stream is joined by the stream flowing from Grayswood and extending thence first generally westward and then generally south-westward along the said last-mentioned boundary for a distance of two and a quarter miles or thereabouts (thereby following for the most part the course of the said stream flowing from Grayswood as aforesaid) to the point opposite to the north-western end of the fence forming the south-western boundary of Fowlshatch Copse and extending thence south-eastward for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts along the last-described fence to its south-eastern end on the north-western side of the road called Prestwick-lane leading from Prestwick Farm towards Haslemere and extending thence in a direction due south and in a straight line for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Chiddingfold from a certain detached portion of the parish of Witley aforesaid, and extending thence first eastward then south-eastward, then south-westward and then westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of forty-nine chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through the south-western portion of Frilinghurst Wood) to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said parish of Chiddingfold from the parish of Haslemere aforesaid and extending thence first southward then north-westward and south-westward then south-eastward and then again south-westward along the last-described boundary for a distance of one mile and three chains or thereabouts to the point to the south-east of the buildings known as Holdfast Farm and extending thence in a direction due north and in a straight line for a distance of ten and a half chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream flowing past Holdfast Farm aforesaid and Imbham's Farm towards Chiddingfold and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-described stream for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the point near the said Holdfast Farm where the same stream is crossed by the road leading from the last-named farm towards Grayswood aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward and then northward along the last-described road for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past Manor House towards Haslemere and extending thence first generally westward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to the point where the said road leading past Manor House towards Haslemere joins the Old Grayswood-road and extending thence northward along the fence on the western side of the said Old Grayswood-road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction near the lodge at the southern entrance to the house and grounds called Grayhurst, with the fence forming the south-western boundary of Grayswood Common and extending thence north-westward along the said boundary of Grayswood Common for a dis-

tance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the point on the south-eastern side of the Portsmouth Direct Line of the London and South Western Railway aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Haslemere from a certain detached portion of the parish of Chiddingfold aforesaid, and continuing thence north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of half a chain or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the said line of railway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the same line of railway for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the parish of Chiddingfold from the parish of Witley aforesaid and extending thence westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the parish of Chiddingfold from the parish of Thursley aforesaid, and extending thence first generally westward and then south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Haslemere from the parish of Thursley aforesaid, and extending thence first generally westward then south-westward then north-westward then northward and then again westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it strikes the stream which flows from Hindhead Common towards Shotter Mill and extending thence in a direction due west and in a straight line for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point upon the eastern boundary of Hindhead Common and extending thence first generally northward and then generally north-eastward along the said boundary of the same common for a distance of one mile and ten chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Thursley from the parish of Witley aforesaid and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and three-quarters or thereabouts to the firstly hereinbefore mentioned point on the southern side of the high road leading from Sandhills towards Hindhead as aforesaid where the said last-mentioned boundary turns sharply towards the north along the eastern boundary of Park-lane Cottages at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.
