Paris, Dec. 28. The Letters from the Camp before Montmelian of the 18th told us, that their Miners were working at the foot of the Battion of Beauvofia, and that working at the foot of the Battion of Beauvosu, and that they hoped to have their Mine ready to the 21st, And that in the mean time, upon advice or the Duke of Savoy's being on his march to relieve the Place, Monneur Catinat was drawing all the Toops he could from Susa, and Dauphine, to reinforce his Army, and to guard the Pales.
