## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 8TH JANUARY 1901.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by certain Steamships.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any animals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamships "King's Lynn," registered at the port of King's Lynn, official number 77334, "Burton," registered at the port of Boston, official number 93408, or "Peterborough," registered at the port of Boston, official number 65115, and such con-

veyance of animals by those vessels is hereby prohibited accordingly.

Prohibition of Landing of Carcases, &c.

- 2. It shall not be lawful for any person to land in Great Britain:
  - (a) a carcase of an animal which has been carried on any of the vessels to which this Order relates from a port in a prohibited country; or

(b) the dung of any such animal; or

- (c) any partly consumed or broken fodder that has been supplied to any such animal; or
- (d) any litter that has been used for or about any such animal.

Power of seizure and detention.

3. The Principal Officer of Customs may seize and detain any carcase dung fodder or litter landed in contravention of this Order, and he shall forthwith report the facts to the Commissioners of Customs who may give such directions as they think fit for the destruction or disposal thereof.

Offences.

- 4.—(1.) If an animal is conveyed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any carcase, dung. fodder, or litter is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing where such carcase, dung, fodder, or litter is landed, and also the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

### Interpretation.

5. In this Order-

- "Prohibited Country" means a scheduled country within the meaning of the Foreign Animals Order of 1896:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and
- "Carcase" means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, flesh, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof:

"Fodder" means hay or other substance com-

monly used for food of animals:
"Litter" means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals:

"Master" includes a person having the charge or command of the vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

# Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one.
