

Castle Cottages aforesaid and extending thence in a direction due south and in a straight line for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to the county boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Churt from the parish of Headley aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned parish and county boundary for a distance of one mile and sixty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point distant eight and a half chains or thereabouts to the south-east of the southern end of Barford Pond where the same boundary is crossed by the road or footpath leading from Hatch Farm towards the house called or known as 'Llanover' and extending thence first westward then southward and then again westward along the middle of the same road or footpath for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction at the southern corner of the grounds attached to the said house called or known as 'Llanover' with the road leading from Barford Paper Mill to Grayshott Hall and extending thence in a direction a little to the west of south and in a straight line across Headley Common for a distance of fifty-three chains or thereabouts to a point on the road leading from Arford to Grayshott where it is joined by a roadway leading on to Ludshott Common and continuing along the last-mentioned roadway for a distance of one and a half chains or thereabouts to the point upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Headley from the parish of Bramshott in the said county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester aforesaid and extending thence first south-eastward next southward next north-eastward and then eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of two and a half miles or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from Saint Luke's Church at Grayshott past High Pitfold towards Shotter Mill is joined by the road called or known as Stony Bottom and where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of Bramshott from the new parish of Saint Stephen Shotter Mill aforesaid and extending thence first southward then westward and south-westward next eastward and then south-eastward along the last-described parish and county boundary for a distance of two miles or thereabouts (thereby passing the east and south of the estate known as Kingswood Firs) to the point distant two chains or thereabouts to the north-east of the milestone on the said high road from London to Portsmouth indicating a distance of eleven miles from Petersfield at which point the same parish and county boundary crosses the same high road and extending thence eastward and in a straight line for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from Grayshott Church past High Pitfold towards Shotter Mill as aforesaid is joined by the road leading to Nutcombe and by the road leading to and past the houses called or known respectively as 'Ennini' 'Log House' 'Woodlands' 'Hazlemount' and 'Heatherbrae' and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where it bends sharply to the north-west, and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of forty-nine chains or thereabouts thereby passing close to the south-eastern side of Hazel Grove Cottage to the point where the road leading from Shotter Mill past Hindhead School towards Frensham Common as aforesaid is joined by a roadway leading on to Hindhead Common and extending thence along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along

the southern side of the grounds belonging to Hind Head House) to the above-mentioned boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen Shotter Mill from the parish of Thursley aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to the firstly hereinbefore mentioned point in the middle of the high road from London to Portsmouth aforesaid where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Shotter Mill of the said new parish of Saint John Churt and of the said parish of Thursley all meet as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been laid before and approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared for the purpose of being laid before Her said late Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-second day of November in the year one thousand nine hundred in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Faith Great Crosby situate within the new parish of Saint Luke Great Crosby in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Luke Great Crosby and of the district chapelry of Saint Mary Waterloo Park in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and such district chapelry respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Luke Great Crosby and of the said district chapelry of Saint Mary Waterloo Park should be formed into a consoli-
