THE following Statutes, made on the fourteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred, and on the fifth day of December, one thousand nine hundred, by the Governing Body of Christ Church, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE XXIII, as altered by the Governing Body on the fourteenth November, one thousand nine hundred, and fifth December, one thousand nine hundred: (1) by the omission of the second and third paragraphs of the addition to the Statute approved by the Queen in Council on the seventh August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and (2) by the addition of the words in *italics*—

Statute XXIII.—College Exhibitions.

The Exhibitions of the Foundations of Archbishop Boulter for Servitors, Mr. Paucefort, Dr Gardiner, Bishop Frampton, Dr. Cotton and Mrs. Paul shall be applied to the support of College Exhibitioners, who shall be elected after examination in such subjects and such manner as the Governing Body shall determine. If and so far as these funds are insufficient, the support of these Exhibitioners shall be charged on the General Revenues of the House. Notice of each election shall be given in the same manner as that prescribed above for the election of Open Scholars,
