WHEREAS by Treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in the territories and places within the limits of "The Persia Order in Council, 1889," and "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1889," respectively referred to in this Order as the "Persia Order" and the "Persian Coast Order":

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows, that is to say:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Persia (Regulations) Order in Council, 1901."

2. This Order shall apply to all places within the limits of the Persia Order and the Persian Coast Order respectively, and the expressions "the Order" and the "Consul-General" shall be construed as applying to each of the said Orders as the case may require.

3. The Consul-General may make and alter regulations (to be called King's Regulations) for the following purposes, that is to say:—

(1.) For securing the observance of any Treaty for the time being in force relating to any place within the limits of the Order, or of any native or local law or custom, whether relating to trade, commerce, revenue, or any other matter.

(2.) For the peace, order, and good government of British subjects or British-protected persons

(so far as subject to the Order) within the said limits, in relation to matters not provided for by the Order.

(3.) For requiring returns to be made of the nature, quantity, and value of articles exported from or imported into places within those limits by or on account of British subjects or British-protected persons, and for prescribing the times and manner at, or in which, and the persons by whom such Returns are to be made.

(4.) For the governance, visitation, care and superintendence of prisons.

4. King's Regulations may provide for forfeiture of any goods, receptacles, or things in relation to which, or to the contents of which, any breach of the Regulations is committed.

5. King's Regulations shall not take effect until they are allowed by a Secretary of State: provided that in case of urgency declared in any such Regulations, the same shall take effect before such allowance, and shall continue to have effect unless and until they are disallowed by the Secretary of State, and until notification of such disallowance is received and published by the Consul-General, and such disallowance shall be without prejudice to anything done or suffered under such Regulations in the meantime.

All King's Regulations shall be published by the Consul-General in such manner and at such places as he may think proper.

6. Any person committing any breach of the Regulations shall, in addition to any forfeiture prescribed thereby, be punishable with imprisonment, which may extend to three months, or to a fine, or to both.

7. Any fine imposed for a breach of the Regulations shall not exceed £100 in the case of places within the limits of the Persia Order, or 1,500 rupees in the case of places within the limits of the Persian Coast Order: provided that, in the case of any breach of any native or local law relating to the customs, or under which the exportation or importation of any goods is prohibited or restricted, the fine may extend to a sum equivalent to treble the value of the goods in relation to which the breach is committed.

8. In this Order "breach of the Regulations" includes the breach of any native or local law or custom, the observance of which is required by any King's Regulations.

9. Article 290 of the Persia Order, and Article 49 of the Persian Coast Order, are hereby repealed; but nothing in this Order shall affect the validity

of any Regulations made under those Articles, until superseded or replaced by Regulations made hereunder, or the enforcement of any penalty for any breach of such Regulations while in force.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the day on which it is first publicly exhibited in the office of the Consul-General.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Bicton situate in the county of Salop and in the diocese of Lichfield for the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Leighton-under-the-Wrekin situate in the said county of Salop and in the said diocese of Lichfield :

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bicton is vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Chad, Shrewsbury in the said county of Salop and in the said diocese of Lichfield.

“And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Leighton-under-the-Wrekin is vested in Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield, of Onslow, near Shrewsbury aforesaid Esquire and his heirs and assigns.

“And whereas the Venerable Charles Bulmer Maude, Archdeacon of Salop, the present vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the said parish of Saint Chad Shrewsbury and the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield have respectively signified

to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Bicton and Leighton-under-the-Wrekin may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices and vicarages are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Charles Bulmer Maude and with the consent of the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bicton and the church thereof, shall be assigned and transferred from the said Charles Bulmer Maude the vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the said parish of Saint Chad Shrewsbury and from his successors vicars or incumbents of the same vicarage and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield and his heirs and assigns for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Leighton-under-the-Wrekin and the church thereof, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield and from his heirs and assigns and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Charles Bulmer Maude vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the said parish of Saint Chad Shrewsbury and his successors, vicars or incumbents of the same vicarage for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

And whereas one of Her late Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that he was of opinion that the Order in Council of eighth June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, as varied by the Order in Council of fifth June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, in so far as it affects burials in the burial-ground or churchyard of Saint John's Church, Manchester, should be further varied, and that the following directions should be substituted for those contained in the said Orders, with respect to burials in the said churchyard:

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed, at their decease, of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

GREAT MAPLESTEAD, ESSEX.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Great Maplestead in the county of Essex, and also in the Dynes Hall Private Chapel attached to the church.

MANSTON, YORKSHIRE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Manston in the county of York; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed, at their decease, of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

(c.) In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in, and which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed, at their decease, of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

YOXFORD, SUFFOLK.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Yoxford in the county of Suffolk; and also in the churchyard, after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed, at their decease, of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

(c.) In reserved grave spaces not exceeding six in number which have never before been buried in, and which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed, at their decease, of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

**ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ACTS,
1870-1899.**

THE Board of Education have issued an order
this day for the compulsory formation of a School
