PASSPORTS IN SWITZERLAND.

Foreign Office, March 4, 1901.

HIS Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Minister at Berne a Despatch pointing out that foreigners intending to reside in Switzerland are required to take out, within eight days after their arrival, "permis de séjour ou d'établissement" (permits of temporary or permanent residence), which are obtainable only on production of a passport. His Majesty's Minister strongly recommends that, in these circumstances, British subjects proceeding to Switzerland should provide themselves in advance with Foreign Office passports.

(Translation.)

Notice Respecting Restrictions on Imports and Transit Goods from Cape Colony and Natal.
March 1st, 1901.

In view of the law respecting the combatting of diseases dangerous to the community of June 30th, 1900 (Reichsgesetzblatt, p. 306), and the notice respecting the restrictions on imports and transit goods for keeping off the danger of cholera and the plague of July 4th, 1900 (Reichsgesetzblatt, p. 555), the following regulations are hereby put in force from the day of their publication.

1. The import and transit of body linen, old and worn articles of clothing, used bed clothes, and rags of all kinds from Cape Colony and Natal is forbidden.
2. The prohibition under section 1 does not

apply to body linen, bed clothes, and articles of clothing, which travellers bring with them for their own use, or which are introduced as change clothing. Nevertheless permission to import them may be made dependent on a preliminary disinfection.

3. The Chancellor of the Empire is empowered to allow exceptions from the prohibition subject to the arrangement of necessary measures of precaution.
