

8. French (translation from and into the language).

9. Elementary Mathematics, viz.:—Euclid, Books I to IV, and Algebra up to and including the Binomial Theorem.

10. Inorganic Chemistry, with Elements of Physics.

N.B.—*Not more than five of the subjects numbered 4 to 10 may be offered.*

8. Examinations will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint.

4. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

5. A fee of £3 will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.
