

No. 265.—AFRICA—EAST COAST.

Delagoa Bay—Pilot's Hulk Moved.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 620 of 1900:—

Information has been received from Captain C. Burney, His Majesty's ship "Sappho," dated 5th March, 1901, that the Pilot's hulk has been moved, and is again near the Cockburn Shoal Buoy, in a position with the Pile Lighthouse bearing S. 10° W., distant 4 cables.

Approximate position, lat. 25° 52' 55" S., long. 32° 53' 50" E.

CAUTION.—As this Pilot hulk appears to be liable to be shifted in position, it is evident it cannot be relied on as a navigational mark.

Pipon Island—Light Exhibited, Channel Rock Light-Vessel Withdrawn.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 574 of 1900:—

The Government of Queensland has given notice that, on or about 7th March, 1901, a dioptric fixed light of the 4th order would be exhibited from the southern island of the Pipon Group.

Pipon Island Light is elevated 55 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles, and shows the following sectors:—White from the bearing of N. 72° W., through north, to N. 53° E.; red from N. 53° E. to N. 76° E.; white from N. 76° E. to N. 88° E.

It is exhibited from a skeleton tower 60 feet high, and painted red, erected on the southern island in lat. 14° 7' 20" S., long. 144° 30' 50" E.

On the exhibition of this light Channel Rock Light-vessel was withdrawn.

No. 267.—BALTIC—FEMERN ISLAND.

Marien Lighthouse—Fog Signal Temporarily Discontinued.

THE German Government has given notice, dated 30th March, 1901, that for some months no reliance should be placed on the regular working of the fog siren at Marien Lighthouse, on Femern Island, as the fog-signal station is being rebuilt.
