
#### Commencement.


# (Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one.

### SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising the parishes of Farnhill, Kildwick, Silsden, Steeton with Eastburn, and Oakworth, in the administrative county of the West Riding of the county of York; and also comprising the borough of Keighley.

#### Civil Service Commission, April 23, 1901.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :--

Regulations respecting Temporary Boy Messengers in Government Departments.

1. A Register of Boys for employment as Temporary Boy Messengers in Government Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. The limits of age for registration will be 14 to 16, and Boy Messengers will not be retained as such after reaching the age of 20.

3. Boys may present themselves for examination, at such times as the Commissioners may fix, at the Civil Service Commission. They must be of good health and character, must satisfy the Commissioners of their ability to read and write,\* and must pay a fee of 1s.

4. Whenever the occasional service of Boy Messengers is required by a Department for any period, whether short or long, application will be made to the Civil Service Commissioners, who will select a boy from the list above mentioned. The insertion of a name on the Register will not, however, imply a certainty of employment; it will merely render a boy eligible for employment in case there should be a demand for his services.

5. The pay of Boy Messengers will be at the rate of 9s. per week, rising by 1s. 6d. per week for each year of approved service.

#### Civil Service Commission, April 23, 1901.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland, will be held in London and Dublin, commencing on the 11th June, 1901, under the Regulations, dated the 20th April, 1900, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 23rd May, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

\* Boys who have passed at least the Fifth Standard at some Public Elementary School will not be required to pass any examination in reading and writing.
