## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE: . .

(DATED 23RD MAY 1901.)

KING'S LYNN (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) . Order of 1896 applied to the Borough of King's Lynn.

1.-(1.) The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply tothe borough of King's Lynn, but no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the said borough, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to a apply to the movement of swine where they are winoved through that borough by railway from a place outside that borough to another place outside that borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that borough we did to

sall (3.) Swine may be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Eicence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional cir--cumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Exclusion of Borough of King's Lynn from Scheduled Order.

2. From and after the commencement of this

Order, the Borough of King's Lynn shall cease to form part of the Swine-Fever Infected Area

declared by the Order described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that such withdrawal shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under such Order aud the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

#### Offences.

3. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and one.

### Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the King's Lynn (Swine-Fever) Order of 1901.
