Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, May 25, 1901.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Representative at Berlin, enclosing the following Memorandum with regard to precautions ordered to be taken against the introduction of plague:—

It is announced in the "Norddeutsche Zeitung" of the 17th instant, that special instructions have been sent to Königsberg, Danzig, Stettin, Hanover, Schleswig, and Coblenze, with regard to the precautions that are to be taken at those ports and harbours against the introduction of the plague through the medium of rats and the refuse from ships.

These new orders provide—

1. That vessels on which plague is shown to have broken out amongst the rats are to be treated in the same manner as ships on which the plague has appeared among human beings. They are therefore liable to the same regulations as those in force in the coast Provinces for sea-going vessels infected with plague.

2. Special attention is to be paid to the disposal of refuse from infected ships or on those under observation. Before such refuse is removed from the ship to be burned, it must be soaked with lime water or with "Sublimate."
