Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the points above mentioned.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 11TH JUNE 1901.)

LUTON (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 applied to the Borough of Luton.

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply to the borough of Luton, but no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the said borough, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through that borough by railway from a place outside that borough to another place outside that borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that borough.

(3.) Swine may be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after

inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Exclusion of Borough of Luton from Scheduled Order.

2. The borough of Luton shall cease to form part of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by the Order described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that such withdrawal shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under such Order and the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Offences.

3. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the LUTON (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.
