A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring His Majesty's Pleasure touching His Royal Coronation, and the Solemnity thereof.

EDWARD, R.

WHEREAS We have resolved, by the Favour and Blessing of Almighty God to celebrate the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation, and of the Coronation of Our dearly beloved Consort the Queen, upon a day in June next to be hereafter determined, at Our Palace at Westminster; and forasmuch as by ancient Customs and Usages of this Realm, as also in regard of divers Tenures of sundry Manors, Lands, and other Hereditaments, many of Our loving Subjects do claim and are bound to do and perform divers Services on the said Day, and at the Time of the Coronation, as in Times precedent their Ancestors and those from whom they claim have done and performed at the Coronations of Our famous Progenitors and Predecessors, Kings and Queens of this Realm; We therefore, out of Our Princely Care for the Preservation of the lawful Rights and Inheritances of Our loving Subjects whom it may concern, have thought fit to give Notice of and publish Our Resolution therein, and do hereby give Notice of and publish the same accordingly: And We do hereby further signify, That, by Our Commission under Our Great Seal of the United Kingdom, We have appointed and authorized the Most Reverend Father in God Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Councillor Frederick, Archbishop of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan; our right trusty and right well-beloved Cousin and Councillor Hardinge Stanley Earl of Halsbury, Our Chancellor of Great Britain; the Most Reverend Father in God Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Councillor William Dalrymple, Archbishop of York Primate of England and Metropolitan; Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Cousin and Councillor Spencer Compton Duke of Devonshire, President of Our Council; Our right trusty and entirely beloved Cousin and Councillor Robert Arthur Talbot Marquess of Salisbury, Keeper of Our Privy Seal; Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Cousins and Councillors Henry Duke of Norfolk, Hereditary Earl Marshal of England; William John Arthur Charles James Duke of Portland, Master of Our Horse; Alexander William George Duke of Fife; Our right trusty and entirely beloved

Cousins and Councillors Henry Charles Keith Marquess of Lansdowne, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State; Gavin Marquess of Breadalbane; Our right trusty and right well-beloved Cousins and Councillors Sidney Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery, Lord Steward of Our Household; Edward Hyde Earl of Clarendon, Lord Chamberlain of Our Household; Archibald Philip Earl of Rosebery; John Poyntz Earl Spencer; George Henry Earl Cadogan, Our Lieutenant-General and General - Governor of Ireland; William Waldegrave Earl of Selborne, First Commissioner of Our Admiralty; Charles Robert Earl Carrington; Frederick Sleigh Earl Roberts, Commander-in-Chief of Our Forces; Our right trusty and well-beloved Councillor George Francis Hamilton, commonly called Lord George Francis Hamilton, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State; the Right Reverend Father in God Our right trusty and well-beloved Councillor Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, Our right trusty and well-beloved Councillors Alexander Hugh Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Our Secretary for Scotland; Edward Lord Ashbourne, Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Ireland; Michael Lord Morris and Killanin; Henry Lord James of Hereford, Chancellor of Our Duchy of Lancaster; James Patrick Bannerman Lord Robertson, Lord of Appeal in Ordinary; Richard Everard Lord Alverstone, Lord Chief Justice of England; Charles Thomson Ritchie, Joseph Chamberlain and St. John Fremantle Brodrick, three of Our Principal Secretaries of State; Sir Michael Edward Hicks-Beach Baronet, Chancellor and Under Treasurer of Our Exchequer; Sir William George Granville Vernon Harcourt; John Blair Balfour, Lord Justice General and President of the Court of Session in Scotland; Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman; Arthur James Balfour, First Commissioner of Our Treasury; Aretas Akers-Douglas, First Commissioner of Our Works and Public Buildings; Sir Francis Henry Jeune, President of the Probate Divorce and Admiralty Division of Our High Court of Justice; and Sir Archibald Levin Smith, Master of the Rolls; or any five or more of them, to receive, hear, and determine the Petitions and Claims which shall be to them exhibited by any of Our loving Subjects in this Behalf; And We do hereby appoint such of Our said Commissioners as may be summoned for that Purpose to sit in the Council Chamber at Whitehall upon Wednesday the Seventeenth Day

of July next at Eleven of the Clock on the Morning of the same Day, and from Time to Time to adjourn as to them shall seem meet, for the Execution of Our said Commission, which We do thus publish, to the Intent that all such Persons whom it may any ways concern may know when and where to give their Attendance for the exhibiting of their Petitions and Claims concerning their Services before mentioned to be done and performed at Our said Coronation: And We do hereby signify and declare that it is Our Royal Will and Pleasure that such part only of the Solemnity and Ceremony of the Royal Coronation of Ourselves and Our dearly beloved Consort the Queen, as is usually upon the Coronation of the Kings and Queens of this Realm solemnized in Westminster Abbey, shall take place. And We do further by this Our Royal Proclamation signify and declare that We do for Ourselves, and for Our dearly beloved Consort the Queen dispense, upon the occasion of this Our Coronation, with the services and attendance of all persons who do claim and are bound to do and perform any services which, according to ancient custom or usage, are to be performed in Westminster Hall or in the Procession. And We do hereby further graciously declare that the same shall not interfere with the rights and privileges of any of Our loving Subjects to claim the performances of such several services or any of them at any future Coronation. And We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare and make known to all such of Our loving Subjects as it may concern, that it seems good to Us that the Committee of Claims shall, upon the occasion of this Our Coronation, exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the Twenty-sixth day of *June*, in the First Year of Our Reign.

AT the Court at *Saint James's*, the 15th day of *June*, 1901.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the fourteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas we are of opinion that there should exist some means of recognizing Distinguished Service before the Enemy on the part of Warrant Officers or Subordinate Officers of Your Majesty's Fleet, who by reason of not holding a Commission in the Royal Navy, are not eligible for appointment to any existing Order or Decoration.

"We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to institute a Decoration, to be designated the Conspicuous Service Cross and to consist of a Silver Cross, with the reverse side plain, but having on the obverse side in the centre Your Majesty's Imperial and Royal Cypher, E.R.I., surmounted by the Imperial Crown.

"We would beg leave to recommend to Your Majesty that this Decoration be awarded for meritorious or distinguished services before the Enemy performed by Warrant Officers or Acting Warrant Officers, or by subordinate Officers of Your Majesty's Fleet: and that no person shall be nominated thereto unless his services shall have been marked by the especial mention of his name in despatches by the Admiral or Senior Naval or Military Officer Commanding the Squadron or detached Force.

"The award of this Decoration to carry with it the right to have the letters C.S.C. appended to the Officer's name.

"We would submit further that the names of those upon whom Your Majesty may be pleased to confer this Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and a registry thereof kept in the Office of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HIS Majesty has been pleased to confer upon—
Lieutenant HALTON STIRLING LECKY, R.N.,
the Albert Medal of the Second Class, on the recommendation of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in recognition of his gallantry in saving life at sea in the following circumstances :—

On the 25th August, 1900, His Majesty's ship "Widgeon," anchored in Kosi Bay, fifty miles south of Delagoa Bay, in order to land stores and troops. The work of disembarkation was carried out by surf boats manned by Malays under the superintendence of Sub-Lieutenant LECKY, who had been sent on shore for the purpose.

Heavy breakers in lines of three to five, according to the tide, rolling in about fifty yards apart, made the work very risky.

One boat loaded with stores and with Second Lieutenant Arnold Gray, Thorneycroft's Mounted Infantry, Trooper Frederick Trethowen, Steinacker's Horse, and Private J. H. Forbes, Thorney-

croft's Mounted Infantry, on board, capsized about three hundred yards from the shore. The five Malays forming the boat's crew, and Private Forbes, by dint of hard swimming, with the assistance of the boat's oars, managed to reach the land after severe buffeting from the heavy seas. Lieutenant Gray was unable to swim, but, with Trooper Trethowen, clung to the boat, which drifted slowly keel upwards in a northerly direction almost parallel with the shore, carried by the set of a strong current. Huge breakers continually swept over the boat, and the men had great difficulty in retaining their hold. Sharks were observed near the boat both before and after the accident. The boat was now about one hundred and fifty yards from the shore. Sub-Lieutenant LECKY, seeing the critical position the two men were in, tore off his clothes and, plunging into the surf, endeavoured to swim to their assistance. He was twice thrown back on the beach by the heavy seas, but afterwards succeeded in bringing first Lieutenant Gray and then the other safe to the shore. The rescued men were quite unconscious, having been nearly thirty minutes in the water. Sub-Lieutenant LECKY and his servant, Private Botting, Royal Marine Light Infantry, then applied the usual methods for restoring animation, and both men eventually recovered consciousness—Lieutenant Gray after a lapse of two and a half hours.
