**No. 459.—ADRIATIC, ITALY—BRINDISI HARBOUR.**

*Riso Point Light—Temporary Alteration in Character.*

THE Italian Government has given notice, that on and after 20th June, 1901, during repairs, the flashing light exhibited from Riso Point Lighthouse would show as a fixed light until further notice.

**No. 460.—SUMATRA, WEST COAST—SIMALUR ISLAND.**

*Tapak Bay Approach—Reef Reported.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 7th June, 1901, that a reef, with a depth of 3½ fathoms over it, is reported to exist in the western approach to Tapak Bay, situated with Pulo Sevelak bearing S. 85° W., distant 12 cables, and the east point of Pulo Tapak about S. 11° E.

Approximate position, lat. 2° 25½' N., long. 96° 14' E.

On the southern, eastern, and northern sides of this reef there is a depth of 10 fathoms, on the western side it shoals gradually.

**No. 461.—THE PHILIPPINES—LEITE ISLAND, EAST COAST.**

*San Pedro and San Pablo Bay—Shoal Reported.*

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 1st June, 1901, of the existence of a shoal 400 yards in extent, irregular in shape, with a depth of 2 fathoms over it in San Pedro and San Pablo Bay, situated with Palos Reef bearing N. 85° W., distant 3 miles, and Dio Island N. 32° W.

Approximate position, lat. 11° 9½' N., long. 125° 4½' E.

Depths of 10 fathoms surround this reef.

**No. 462.—CHILI—CHONOS ARCHIPELAGO.**

*Traiguén Island—Shoals Northward of.*

THE Chilean Government has given notice, dated 15th April, 1901, that the correct position of the shoal marked P.D. on the Charts, and situated about three-quarters of a mile to the northward of the north point of Traiguén Island, is about 4 cables N. 88° W. from the present accepted position as shown on the Chart.

Also, that another shoal (now named Casma Shoal) exists about 1½ miles N. 48° E. from the amended position of the above shoal.

Both these shoals are marked by kelp.

**No. 463.—NEW GUINEA—NEW BRITAIN.**

*Herbertshöh—Light Discontinued.*

THE German Government has given notice, dated 8th June, 1901, that the light beacon on the extremity of the reef situated about 4½ cables N. 6° W. from the observation spot, Herbertshöh having been destroyed, will not be re-erected, the light therefore should be expunged from the Admiralty publications.
