East Triangle Shoal—Amended Position of Beacon.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 714 of 1900:—

From later information received, it appears that the red pyramidal wooden beacon, standing on 4 iron piles, is erected in a depth of 20 feet on the southern side of East Triangle Shoal, Main Ship Channel, Key West, with Key West Lighthouse bearing north, distant 2½ miles, and not in the position given in the above Notice.

Approximate position, lat. 24° 30½' N., long. 81° 48' W.
