WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Warwick) Order, 1901.

Dated 11th July, 1901.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Warwick, I hereby make the following Order :—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Warwick) Order, 1901."

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of Warwick :—

Bittern, Blackcap, Brambling, Bullfinch, Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chiffchaff (Millythrum or Long Bag), Crossbill, Cuckoo, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Golden Oriole, Goldfinch (Proud Tailor), Great Crested Grebe (Loon), Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hen Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Hawfinch, Hedge Sparrow, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel (Windhover), Kingfisher, Kite, Brow Linnet (Pea Linnet), House Martin, Sand Martin, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Norfolk Plover (Stone Curlew), Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny or Wood Owl, Peregrine Falcon, Redpole, Redstart (Firetail or Redtail), Robin (Redbreast), Shrike (Butcher Bird), Red-backed Shrike, Great Grey Shrike, Siskin, Stonechat (Utick), Swallow, Swift, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Great Tit (Black Head), Long-tailed Tit (Bottle Tit or Jack-o'-Bo-peep), Marsh Tit, Tree Creeper, Tree Pipit, Turtle Dove, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler (Willow Wren), Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat (Furzechat), Whitethroat (Haybird, Peggy Whitethroat or Chate), Lesser Whitethroat, Woodlark, Big-spotted Woodpecker, Green Woodpecker (Hickle), Lesser-spotted Woodpecker (French Magpie), Common Wren (Jenny Wren), Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

All Birds Protected on Sundays in Certain Districts.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July, in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the county of Warwick, except that part thereof which is in the Tamworth Rural District.

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Warwick :—

Bittern, Blackcap, Bullfinch, Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff (Millythrum or Long Bag), Crossbill, Cuckoo, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Golden Oriole, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe (Loon), Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hawfinch, Hedge Sparrow,
