*Hawk Channel—Pelican Cay Beacon Light Exhibited, Four-Foot Shoal Light Discontinued.*

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners No. 715 of 1900 and No. 620 of 1899:—

The United States Government has further given notice that, on 16th July, 1901, a white fixed light will be exhibited from a black pyramidal beacon marked P.K., erected in a depth of 11 feet, on a shoal about 1½ miles south-eastward of Pelican Cay, Hawk Channel, with Eastern Sambo Beacon A. bearing S. 30° W., distant 4¼ miles, and America Shoal Lighthouse S. 76° E.

Approximate position, lat. 24° 33' N., long. 81° 37' W.

Also, that on the same day the white fixed light exhibited from Four-foot Shoal Beacon will be discontinued.

No. 519.—SCOTLAND, WEST COAST—KYLE RHEA.

*Research Rock—Position and Particulars of.*

INFORMATION, dated 27th June, 1901, has been received from Captain A. Mostyn Field, His Majesty's surveying-ship "Research," of the existence of a rocky patch, circular in form, 1 cable in diameter, and with depths of from 21 to 29 feet over it, lying nearly mid-channel in the northern part of Kyle Rhea. The shoalest head, now called Research Rock, with a least depth of 21 feet over it, is situated on the south-western part of the patch with Kyle Rhea Lighthouse bearing S. 64° W., distant 5½ cables, and the 718-foot hill on the eastern shore S. 26° E.

From this rock, the patch as defined by the 5-fathom line extends about three-quarters of a cable in a north-easterly and easterly direction, and half-a-cable in a northerly direction, there being a depth of from 6 to 7 fathoms between it and the western shore.

Approximate position, lat. 57° 14½' N., long. 5° 39' W.

NOTE.—The sector of red light shown from Kyle Rhea Lighthouse almost exactly covers the patch.
