Haaks Light-Vessel—Alternative Fog Signal Altered.

THE Netherlands Government has given notice that, during the beginning of September, 1901, the alternative fog signal on board the Haaks Light-vessel, a bell which gives during thick or foggy weather when the siren is disabled two strokes in succession every half minute, will in future be immediately followed by four short blasts from a horn worked by hand.

Taganrog—Wreck in Approach.

THE Russian Government has given notice, dated 21st June, 1901, that the wreck of a two-masted sailing vessel, with the hull above water, lies sunk in a depth of 11 feet in the approach to Taganrog, situated with Taganrog Lighthouse bearing N. 6° E., distant 3 miles.

A black and white buoy, with a ball as a topmark, marks the position.

Sound of Iona—Rocks.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 446 of 1901:—

Further information, dated 9th July, 1901, has been received from Captain A. Mostyn Field, His Majesty's surveying-vessel "Research," that an examination of the rock reported to have a depth on it of 3 feet in the Sound of Iona shows that it has 6 feet over it at low-water springs, and that it is situated with the Free Church on Iona Island bearing N. 44° W., distant 3²/₁₀ cables, and northern extreme of Liath Eilean N. 45° E., or about three-tenths of a cable eastward of its reported position.

Approximate position, lat. 56° 19½' N., long. 6° 23' W.

This rock is marked by a red conical buoy on its south-western side.

Also, that there is a rock with a depth of 9 feet over it, situated with the Free Church bearing N. 43° W., distant 5½ cables, and Liath Eilean, N. 35° E.

There is also another rock, with a depth of 7 feet over it, at a distance of 1 cable, S. 18° W., from the above.

LOCH SUNART.*Resga Island—Particulars of Rock Westward of.*

INFORMATION, dated 9th July, 1901, has been received from Captain A. Mostyn Field, His Majesty's surveying-vessel "Research," that the depth on the rock situated about 2¼ cables westward of Resga Island is 8 feet at low-water springs.

This rock is on the eastern end of a narrow

ridge, about 40 yards long east and west, there being 20 feet on its western extremity; it is steep-to, having depths of 10 fathoms on the north side, 8 and 7 fathoms on its western and south-eastern sides respectively.
