the London Gazette on the ninth day of the same month, the said diocese of Bristol was constituted.

"And whereas by another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the third day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and published in the London Gazette on the eighth day of the same month the said Archdeaconry of Bristol was made to comprise and to be co-extensive with the limits of the said diocese of Bristol and to consist of the following Rural Dean-ries namely the Rural Deanery of Bristol the Rural Deanery of Stapleton the Rural Deanery of Bitton the Rural Deanery of Chippenham and also the Rural Deanery of Malmesbury and the Rural Deanery of Cricklade as the two lastly-mentioned Rural Deaneries are limited by the above-mentioned Order of Her said late Majesty in Council dated the seventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend George Forrest Bishop of the said diocese of Bristol that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconry of Bristol are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly

carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve firstly the abolition of the present Rural Deanery of Bristol and secondly the formation of four new Rural Deaneries to be called respectively 'The Rural Deanery of Bristol City' 'The Rural Deanery of Bedminster' The Rural Deanery of Clifton 'and 'The Rural Deanery of East Bristol' and thirdly the transfer of three cures from the said Rural Deanery of Stapleton to the said proposed new Rural Deanery of Clifton and the transfer of two cures from the said Rural Deanery of Stapleton to the said proposed new Rural

Deanery of East Bristol.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said George Forrest Bishop of the said diocese of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the Commissioners Eccle-iastical recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said present Rural Deanery of Bristol shall be abolished and that in lieu thereof the following four Rural Deaneries shall be constituted namely:-(1) The Rural Deanery of Bristol City (2) the Rural Deanery of Bedminster (3) the Rural Deanery of Clifton and (4) the Rural Deanery of East Bristol and that the cures of Saint Michael and All Angels Bishopston the cure of Horfield and the cure of Westbury-on-Trym with Redland shall be transferred from the said Rural Deanery of Stapleton to the said proposed new Rural Deanery of Clifton and that the cure of Fishponds and the cure of Two Mile Hill shall be transferred from the said Rural Deanery of Stapleton to the said proposed new Rural Deanery of East Bristol and that the said Rural Deanery of Bristol City the said Rural Deanery of Bedminster the said Rural Deancry of Clifton the said Rural Deanery of East Bristol and the said Rural Deanery of Stapleton and the other Rural Deaneries of the said Archdeaconage of Bristol shal respectively comprise and consist of the parishes cures or churches the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of such Rural Deaneries respectively in the Schedule to this scheme annexed and each of the said

parishes or cures or churches shall belong to and be and form part of the Rural Deanery under the name of which it is set down as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery under which it is so set down as aforesaid and subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Bristol and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
