San Nicolas Battery—Provisional Light Still Exhibited.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 356 of 1895:—

The Spanish Government has given notice, dated 18th July, 1901, that a provisional white fixed light is still exhibited from San Nicolas Battery Lighthouse, Malaga, in place of the white fixed light, showing a red flash every two minutes formerly exhibited.

Approximate position, lat. 36° 42' N., long. 4° 24' W.
