In the Matter of the Law Reversionary Interest Society Limited, and in the Matter of the Companies (Memorandum of Association) Act, 1890.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a petition presented to the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, on the 1st day of August, 1901, for confirming a Special Resolution passed on the 3rd day of July, 1901, and confirmed on the 31st day of July, 1901:—"That the Memorandum and Articles of Association submitted to the Meeting, and for the purpose of identification signed by the Chairman thereof, be and the same are hereby approved, and that pursuant to the provisions of the Companies (Memorandum of Association) Act, 1890, the form of the Company's constitution be altered by the substitution of such Memorandum and Articles of Association for the Company's deed of settlement, dated the 18th March, 1853, and for all regulations of the Company subsequently made and now in force; and that the Directors be authorized to apply to the Court to confirm this resolution under the said Act" is directed to be heard before his Lordship Mr. Justice Buckley on Saturday the 2nd day of November, 1901. \* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the local inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure that officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
