No. 618.—BLACK SEA—RUMANIA.

*Kustenjeh (Constanta)—Intended Alteration in Lights.*

THE Rumanian Government has given notice, dated 10th July, 1901, that on the completion of the eastern breakwater at Kustenjeh (probably during the autumn of 1901) the light (alternating red and white) will be transferred from its present position on the old east jetty to the western arm of the new east breakwater, situated at a distance of about 7 cables S. 34° W. from Cape Kustenjeh Lighthouse, and re-exhibited there.

Also, that a red fixed light will be exhibited from the south angle of the extension of the old east jetty, about 4½ cables S. 58° W. from Capo Kustenjeh Lighthouse.

Until these alterations are made the positions of the above lights will each be marked by a red buoy.

Approximate position, Kustenjeh Lighthouse, lat. 41° 10' N., long. 28° 41½' E.
