4. To authorise the Company to purchase and hold further lands for any purposes of their Undertaking, and to confer further powers upon the Company, with respect to the sale, letting, or disposal of land acquired by the Company.

5. To authorise the Company to provide, supply, sell, let, use, and otherwise deal in meters, stoves, engines, motors, dynamos, ranges, pipes, fittings, and other apparatus for warming, lighting, cooking, ventilating, and for motive power, and for all other purposes for which gas may be used, and to fix and remove or alter the same or any other fittings or apparatus, and to provide materials and do work or services in connection therewith, and to supply gas for the aforesaid purposes, and make and recover charges therefor, and to exempt any such articles, fittings, and things from distress, and to make provision for securing the safetý and return thereof to the Company.

6. To amend the provisions of Section 27 of the West Ham Gas Act, 1889 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1889"), and to reduce the illuminating power of the gas prescribed by that section, and to alter the provisions of the said Act with regard to the sliding scale of
