ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 26TH NOVEMBER 1901.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Contraction of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board, dated the thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one; are hereby contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order; and

the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and one.
